MINUTES OF MEETING OF SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA FIREMAN'S ASSOCIATION

SEPTEMBER 14, 1980

The regular meeting of the Southwest Virginia Fireman's Association was held September 14, 1980 at Abingdon, Virginia.

The meeting was called to order at 1:10 p.m. by President Don Stoneman. The invocation was given by Chaplain James Hagy. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Training Committee - Reminded everyone of the two schools in September sponsored by the association. The Pulaski Fire Department requested the sum of one hundred dollars to buy fuel for the smokehouse and the pit fires. Bo McCormick made a motion to pay the one hundred dollars. J. Mack Baker seconded the motion and it passed. They also reported that plans for the April Pump Schools were underway and possible locations were Galax and Wise. Notices will be out when plans are final.

Frank Hubble discussed the possibility of giving an Outstanding Instructor Award in memory of Bucky Meredith. This would go to the most outstanding instructor of the two Association schools. A motion was made to this effect and passed. The Training Committee will be in charge of all details.

He also discussed the need to promote Public Fire Safety in the Southwest Area. A Federal grant has been received for this purpose and a two day seminar will be set up on how we can show people how to prevent fires and to protect their own lives.

Film Committee - Harold Burton advised that last year's film, "Will Your Job Burn" is now in the library. Roy Redd made a motion that the Film Committee purchase a new film this year. J. Lloyd Gregory seconded the motion and it passed. If anyone has any suggestions, contact the Film Committee.

OLD BUSINESS:

J. Mack Baker discussed the badges for the past presidents. It was decided that we would purchase gold plated badges. Martin Keffer will work out the details with Jack Slagle, Jerry Clark, and Hugh Whitlow on purchasing these to be presented at the 1981 Convention.

Frank Hubble was asked to see if the General Firemanship patches could be set up over the 120 HOUR LEVEL for men who have taken more training. Frank asked that each department keep their own training records because his office does not have time to tell each man how many hours of training he has.

NEW BUSINESS:

Bo McCormick, Abingdon Fire Chief, welcomed everyone to Abingdon and thanked everyone for attending.

He also discussed that the Washington County Fireman's Association has received a lot from the Washington County School Board to be used as a fire training ground in Abingdon. He advised the facility would be available to any Fire Department or Rescue Squad. The Washington County Association will be applying for state funding and asked for the support of the Southwest Virginia Fireman's Association. J. Mack Baker made a motion that the Association write a letter to support this facility. Dan Ryan seconded the motion and it passed. The Secretary was instructed to draft a letter to this effect.

Tom Jordon advised that a training ground was almost complete in Goeburn and would like to see the Association have a school there. He also stated that we needed to contact the departments in Wise County to get them interested in the Association. The President said to have them attend a meeting and show some interest and we would go to Wise for the next meeting.

The next meeting will be January 11, 1981 at Radford Fire Station.

The 1981 Convention is scheduled for June 5-6, 1981 at the Dutch Inn in Collinsville.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:10 p.m. The meeting was followed by a most delicious meal at the fire station.

Chief Hall reported that no students under the age of eighteen years would be allowed to attend any schools at the Pulaski Training Center. He also suggested that all instructors do the same until the Federal Ruling on minors and firefighting could be fully interpreted.

ONE MAN DRESSING CONTEST

To consist of one person.

Race against time.

Each contestant shall furnish the following equipment:

(A) helmet

(B) coat

(C) knee-length boots

Boots, coats, and helmets to be 50 feet from starting line.

Judges to place coat, helmet, and boots.

Finish line to be 50 feet beyond gear, totaling 100 feet from starting line.

Person must have street shoes on at the starting line

Gear must be on and 3 snaps fastened on coat before crossing finish line or be disqualified.

Hands must be over head and hold same until checked by judge.

Contest to have 3 timers and 1 judge.

In any dispute, the decision of the head judge will be final.

THREE MAN DRESSING CONTEST

Team to consist of three people.

Race against time.

Each contestant shall furnish the following equipment:

(A) helmet

(B) coat

(C) knee-length boots

Boots, coats, and helmets to be 50 feet from starting line.

Judges to place coat, helmet, and boots.

Finish line to be 50 feet beyond gear, totaling 100 feet from starting line.

Team must have shoes on at the starting line.

Gear must be on and 3 snaps fastened on coat before crossing finish line or be disqualified.

Any man may step back before last man raises hands.

Team must raise hands over head and hold same until checked by judge.

Time stops when last man raises hands.

An average time of all three team members will be the team's time.

Contest to have 3 judges and 6 timers.

In any dispute, the decision of the head judge will be final.

ONE MAN HOSE COUPLING CONTEST

Two 50 foot sections, national standard 2-1/2 inch fire hose coupled and laid in straight line.

2-1/2 inch nozzle and two 50 foot sections of hose will be furnished by committee.

Runner to stand 50 feet from center line with 2-1/2 inch nozzle in hand.

When signal is given, run 50 feet from center line, lay nozzle down, break coupling, and put nozzle on.

Nozzle must be tight.

Time stops when nozzle hits ground.

Judge to make sure nozzle is tight.

Half-second penalty added to time for each half-turn of nozzle to make it tight.

In any dispute, the decision of the head judge is final.

Contest to have 1 judge and 3 timers.

AIR PAC CONTEST

Each contestant must be dressed in full turn-out gear.

Helmet goes on head,

Coat must be buckled, knee-length boots on.

All contestants must furnish air pac.

Air pacs to be placed 50 feet from starting line, finish 50 feet beyond.

Air line from tank must be closed before contest starts.

Shoulder and waist straps to be pulled snug.

Face piece to be put on with all straps pulled tight for a good seal.

Air valve to be open and hose to be connected to regulator.

All air pacs to be checked by the head judge to insure equality.

Judge to check all air pacs to see if tank valve is closed and straps are extended to fullest amount before starting next contestant.

Contest to have 1 judge and 3 timers with head judge's decision final.
